SAFETY REQUIRMENTS:

Competitors are required to follow all industry safety standards during the competition.

PURPOSE OF CHALLENGE:

To evaluate student’s proficiency and creativity in the production of a television news style feature video. Video must be 2 – 3 minutes in length.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE EVALUATED:

Students will be judged by the way in which their products capture or explain a particular aspect of the Skills Canada event. The projects should:

- Be interesting and informative while maintaining a focus.
- Have a beginning, middle and end.
- Exhibit an appropriate pace that keeps viewers interested.
- Look and sound as professional as possible.

Recommendations:

- Obtain as much information about the event as you can. As a team discuss different options for a possible story and then go with one that seems the most appealing or original.
- If you choose to have reporter(s) appear on camera, they should be dressed appropriately.
- Begin the project with as much of a detailed plan as possible but don’t be afraid to deviate from that plan if better ideas come up during shooting or editing.
- Analyze some local news story (5W’s)
- Practice news style shooting.
- Use of camera microphone is NOT recommended!

CLOTHING REQUIRMENTS:

Competitors must supply: Appropriate Business Attire.

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS:

Supplied by committee:

- Electrical hook-up requirement specified by committee.
- Mini-DV tape.
- *I-Movie*
- *I-Life '04*.
- Edit system- linear or non-linear, any format but restricted to **cuts only** editing.
- Computer if using software other than: *I-Movie* or *I-Life '04*

Competitor must supply:

- Cameras- any format or type that works with your video editing system.
- Must be able to provide final movie on mini-dv.
- All written documentation from the day so the judges can see it.

Each team has the option of also including the following:

- Audio gear (microphone, cable, any other audio device).
- Lighting gear – portable camera lights or lighting kits.

NOTE: CLEARLY MARK ALL YOUR EQUIPMENT; COMPETITORS WILL ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ALL EQUIPMENT. NO COPYRIGHT MUSIC IS ALLOWED!
